<b>Minutes and matters arising</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each Class Council had discussed the ways we celebrate success in school and how this could be developed. All classes enjoy the use of team points and feel they are motivated by them, however they felt that the teams may be uneven. Miss Proctor explained that the spread of children in each team may appear to be uneven in their class (due to siblings), however across the school they should be fairly even.</li> <li>• All classes enjoy one person from each year group being chosen for 'Star of the Week' and said that the 'Star of the Week' could receive a trophy/medal to wear instead of a certificate. Every class had also suggested that the 'Star of the Week' should attend a special VIP lunch each week with milkshakes, a table cloth, treat desserts and a member of staff eating with them at the table! They said they would all look forward to this and asked if each 'Star of the Week' would be able to invite a plus one!</li> <li>• Classes felt that the attendance trophy could be replaced with a new one, as it has been in school for a long time, but felt that the extra play was a good reward to motivate them to come into school even when they don't feel 100%!</li> <li>• One class suggested that we have a celebration board to celebrate non-academic achievements such as swimming certificates and photos of sports events that we have won! Theo suggested that we use the old team points board to display this.</li> <li>• Several children mentioned the use of 'Golden Time' as a reward for special occasions, such as when your class wins the attendance for the term or for the winning team to attend!</li> <li>• Everyone agreed that non-uniform days and extra play are a far better reward to motivate them than cakes / treats because they last longer!</li> </ul>
