<b>Minutes and matters arising</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Each class had discussed possible new texts to buy for the home reading scheme. Willow Class felt that they would really benefit from new books to choose from and were excited at the prospect of the books being updated.</li> <li>- The themes identified across school were; mystery, mythology, detective, comedy, thriller, fantasy, adventure, comics and non-fiction about sport and science.</li> <li>- Miss Proctor will work with the new School Council in September to update our home school reading scheme.</li> <li>- Each class had a really good discussions about the things that they have enjoyed and the things that they dislike about the COVID 19 changes. Many children had identified pros and cons of the changes, but the overall consensus was as follows:                         <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Re-introduce celebration and star of the week assembly as everyone likes being together and the 'Star of the Week' boosts people's confidence.</li> <li>• Buddies should start again for the new Reception children.</li> <li>• Keep wearing PE kits on our PE days so we don't need to worry about our privacy.</li> <li>• Key Stage 2 like sitting at tables and not on the carpet because the carpet is itchy, squashed and uncomfortable.</li> <li>• Sitting in rows is better so that we don't get distracted and we are all facing the front so that no-one needs to turn, but we don't like always having to sit with the same people.</li> <li>• It is nice for Key Stage 2 to be able to play ball games without having to worry about hurting the younger children, but it would be nice to socialise more.</li> <li>• Children in Key Stage 1 and EYFS would like to be able to play in the bigger space on the playground.</li> <li>• Everyone misses team points because they were good motivation.</li> <li>• It is better when we have separate toilets for boys and girls.</li> </ul> </li> <li>- Miss Proctor will share the children's feedback with our SLT.
