Minutes and matters arising	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Each class had discussed the non-sports based clubs that they would love to take part in after school. The common ideas included a baking/cooking club and an arts and craft club, which were suggested by all classes. Miss Proctor will share these ideas with the teachers for planning upcoming clubs and activities. - Everyone had suggested great names for the central area and old key stage two cloakroom. Several classes had suggested names with a forest focus, which everyone thought was a great idea. Following a discussion, we decided to put forward the following names: central area could be the foxes den and the old KS2 cloakroom could be the woodland workers area. - We discussed what our 'non negotiables' should be for book corners across school, following the work all the Class Councils had put in place. We agreed that every book corner must have: a seating area, wide range of books that are refreshed every teaching block with Class Councils, they should be well-organised and have attractive displays of books, librarians who keep it tidy and organised. Miss Proctor will type these and share with class teachers before they are introduced in each class after half term - Everyone had fantastic ideas for how we could host a 'grand opening' of our library. Jack thought that we should have a big ribbon to cut, and we decided that each class could have a ribbon to cut across their class door leading to the library. They thought that the School Council could let off confetti canons and we could invite the school governors and mayor and mayoress to attend too. After that, on one night for the rest of the week, each class could invite their parents to visit the library at 3:15 with them for refreshments (hot chocolate and cake) and to choose books to borrow. Miss Proctor will share these ideas with our school leadership team and begin to plan the event!
