	Acorn class discussed the definition and most children were happy with it. Some children were unsure what some words meant such as verbal so we suggested that adding some examples would be useful. We discussed the procedure for bullying and children thought it was fine. One child suggested adding that bullying should be dealt with straight away because they felt that sometimes it is left for a while before being dealt with. Role of children - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Say 'NO' - Tell a trusted grown-up - Walk away - Children were unsure about the 'Whisper Button' so we looked at it together - Use the 'Thought Eater' if you don't want to speak to an adult straight away

	We have discussed the definition of bullying and we all agree this is correct and we don't need to make any changes to this section of the policy. After a discussion in class, we have considered that the first point made in the 'suspecting bullying step-by-step' needs to be removed; we don't think that this is used in the steps to identifying bullying or trying to solve bullying in our school. Role of children - we think the following phrases need to be included in this section of the policy: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - tell a trusted adult. - remember to always say 'NO!' - try not to show your 'yucky feelings' but if you do, make sure you speak to your trusted adult. - use the school website to use the 'Whisper Button' to share our online worries and concerns with a trusted adult. - use the 'Tell Me Box' or 'Thought Eater' to share any worries or concerns with adults in our school.
