Minutes and matters arising	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Noah welcomed everyone today and shared our agenda. 2. Each Class Council had discussed our current Anti-Bullying Policy, with a particular focus on the children's role in preventing bullying. Each class agreed with the definition of bullying and Acorn Class suggested that examples to complement the wording might be beneficial, for example when talking about 'verbal bullying'. When discussing the role of children in preventing bullying, all classes had made links to their KidSafe work and mentioned the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • saying 'no', • telling a 'trusted adult', • walking away and not fighting back. Classes had also discussed and located the whisper button on our website and had mentioned the use of Thought Eaters for children who might not want to speak in front of other children to an adult. 3. We had no suggestions in our box this week. 4. Each class discussed what they had been learning in PSHE this year, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KidSafe, • eating healthily, • looking after our bodies and hygiene, • puberty, • aspirations, • drugs, alcohol and tobacco education. The majority of children felt that what they learn will help prepare them for getting older, especially at high school and that being informed about good choices might help them make them. One child felt like they discuss a lot of this information at home already. 5. Councillors identified what we do really well at our school, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sports, • clubs, • School Council, 		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • learning new things, • attendance, • bright classrooms, • great displays, and • looking after each other. <p>They said that things that could improve our school further include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • making sports day more competitive, • more resources for classrooms (pencils, pens, whiteboard pens, art resources), • improving the playground and lunches (messy tables, more time to eat and bigger portions for Key Stage Two). <p>6.
